

AAC EVALUATION SUPPORT

WATI Assistive Technology Consideration to Assessment

12 sections ranging from hearing/vision, to seating/positioning, to communication. AT decision making guide. AT checklist. AT trial use guide for documentation. Cost is free.

Functional Communication Profile - Revised (FCP-R)

Criterion-referenced assessment. 10 subtests ranging from sensory/motor to communication. Yields an overall inventory of communication abilities, mode of communication, and degree of independence. Assess through direct observation, teacher or caregiver report, or 1:1 testing. Costs \$75 for a complete kit.

Dynamic Assessment Goals Grid (DAGG-2)

Checklist to ensure all of Light's (1989) communication competencies are considered. Allows evaluator to analyze patterns of strengths and weaknesses & determine next steps for intervention. Also includes: Ability Level Continuum and AAC Goals Worksheet/Progress Reporting. Cost is free.

SETT Framework by Dr. Joy Zabala

Student, Environment, Tasks, Tools. Pushes us away from considering the tool first and forces us to make student-centered decisions. Really great for collaborative decision-making. Cost is free.

Communication Matrix

Online assessment tool. Simple enough for parents to complete and share. Available in 14 languages. Created to help professionals and family members support individuals with severe communication disorders. Shares anonymous data to help others learn more about communication skills in various populations. Cost is free to start.

AAC Evaluation Genie App

13 subtests available ranging from visual discrimination to core vocab to word prediction. Helps you build a framework for selecting an appropriate device for ongoing trials. Accommodates both direct select and scanning. Helps you keep AAC evaluations organized and systematic. Cost is \$12.99.

Assessment of Learning Process (ALP) for AAC

It provides a framework for understanding the progression in AAC access learning and helps you determine how to progress them to the next stage. Cost is free.

AAC PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

AAC in the Cloud Conference (www.aacconference.com)

Free, annual, virtual AAC conference. You can participate live or watch the recordings from the archive. Sessions covering a range of topics.

Assistive Technology Industry Association (ATIA)

The ATIA conference is the world's most extensive assistive technology conference showcasing international excellence in the field. You can register for a variety of strands and choose to participate either in-person or virtually. This conference is hosted in Florida.

Closing the Gap Conference

he Closing The Gap Conference is an annual assistive technology conference that presents an opportunity to deepen your assistive technology (AT) knowledge and strengthen your implementation strategies. This conference is hosted in Minnesota.

#TalkingAAC Conference

Our mission is to continue engaging the #TalkingAAC community in an ongoing conversation about high-quality supports for those learning to communicate using AAC, while continuing to learn from those who use AAC on a daily basis. This conference is hosted in Michigan.

AAC Ally by Rachel Madel

A self-paced step-by-step course to conduct a dynamic and collaborative AAC assessment and effectively coach communication partners. This course is only available a few times each year, so keep an eye out!

AAC for Gestalt Language Processors by Meaningful Speech

Our self-paced course will teach you how to identify, evaluate, and support gestalt language processors (GLPs) who currently communicate using augmentative and alternative communication (AAC) or who you think may benefit from AAC.

Authentic AAC by Kate McLaughlin (Learn Play Thrive)

In this course, Kate McLaughlin, CCC-SLP gives you the tools you need to support your emergent communicators in a way that fosters their autonomy, self-determination, and connection to those around them. This course is 12 contact hours and is registered for 1.2 ASHA CEUs and 1.2 AOTA CEUs.

AAC FUNDING SUPPORT

State Telecommunications Assistance Programs

In many states, you can qualify for an AAC device if your communication impairment prevents you from being able to access the telephone. In Texas, this is called STAP. Check your state resources!

Major AAC Device Companies

Major AAC Device Companies such as TobiiDynavox and PRC-Saltillo have robust funding portals on their website that walk you step-by-step through the funding process.

Talk to Me Technologies

TTMT exclusive vocabulary sets, GoTalk Now Plus, Dialogue, TouchChat WordPower, LAMP, Proloquo2Go, Proloquo4Text, Predictable, Speak for Yourself, Coughdrop, Avaz, SuperCore, Grid, PODD. See website for details.

AbleNet QuickTalker Freestyle

"App agnostic." Choose any speech app from the App Store and device size with the option to change later at no cost. 31.8 days is the average time it takes AbleNet to fund a device and help someone start their AAC journey.

Lilly's Voice

Our goal is to assist children ages 2 - 18 that have been rejected by other programs and whose families cannot afford an AAC device without help. If you have tried other avenues to get AAC for your Autistic, nonspeaking family member, and need help getting an AAC device on your own, please submit a request form!

Apraxia Foundation Scholarship

Apply for the 3-month AAC application process that began May 1, 2023. They will grant AAC devices to several families on July 1st, 2023. This may not be available all the time. Email theapraxiafoundation@theapraxiafoundation.org

School-Based Assistive Technology

Check with your local public school district to request an Assistive Technology evaluation for AAC. If there is an educational need, your child could be provided an AAC device by the district.

MANUAL COMMUNICATION BOARDS

AssistiveWare Core Word Classroom

AssistiveWare has different Core word boards to support our different AAC apps. All boards have a mix of core words, fringe words and include an alphabet. Some boards are also available in Dutch, Spanish and French.

Saltillo Chat Corner

These low-tech printable options are available to support some of the WordPower™ files. Pre-made downloadable options are offered for the WordPower42 Basic, 60 Basic, 60 and the 108 location files.

LAMP Words for Life Manual Core Board

Available in AAC Language Lab. Use these manual communication boards for a student who does not have access to their device, for modeling language or for a student who does not have their device yet to familiarize them with the LAMP Words for Life vocabulary layout.

Universal Core Communication Systems - Project Core

The Universal Core vocabulary is a set of 36 highly useful single words that can be used alone or in combination to communicate for a range of purposes on countless topics with a wide variety of communication partners. Several formats are available to support student access through direct pointing or touch, eye gaze selection, and partner-assisted scanning.

TobiiDynavox Communication Boards

Download and print PDF books of the core word page from our TD Snap app. These communication books are a great introduction to language for symbol-supported communicators before they get their device. Keep them on hand as a simple solution to be used in the car, at the playground, near the pool, or anywhere else it might be inconvenient to use a device.

Talk to Me Technologies Playground Core Boards

TTMT Core + Fringe Communication boards were designed with inclusion in mind, providing easy, convenient access to the most common words used to communicate across multiple settings. Available in post mount, A-Frame, and vinyl options.

Stakeholders include (but are not limited to) practitioners, academics, designers, parents, families, and users of AAC. These agreements are supported by research whenever possible. ASHA Evidence Map for AAC

An Evidence Map is a searchable online tool designed to assist clinicians with making evidence-based decisions. Each Evidence Map highlights the importance of the three components of evidence-based practice—external scientific evidence, clinical expertise, and client perspectives—and provides the latest information related to the assessment, treatment, and service delivery for various communication disorders.

ASHA Wire Journal Articles

ASHAWire is the online home for ASHA journals, The ASHA Leader, and Perspectives of the ASHA Special Interest Groups. You can use ASHAWire to search a fully interconnected network of articles, as well as browse most recent and trending research.
